From the Chairman

For some reason I have seen more absurd journal articles this last month than in a long time. I think the surging number of journals and the pressure to publish has resulted in the increase of publication nonsense.

For example, a study out of Korea with 161,286 subjects enrolled in a National Health Insurance System Health Screening Cohort found that brushing your teeth three or more times a day resulted in decreased risk for heart failure and atrial fibrillation. The results weren't significant, but there was a trend towards a positive finding after 12 years of study. The study showed that you could brush your teeth at least 3 times a day for 12 years or visit the dentist at least once in those 12 years to have the same positive outcome. Losing interest in the study yet?

The next one I enjoyed was a study from China that revealed an increased risk of cardiovascular disease in subjects with insomnia. Insomnia was defined as difficulties in initiating or maintaining sleep, early morning awakening or daytime dysfunction at least 3 days per week. Since these symptoms apply to a large percentage of people you can now start to worry when you can't fall asleep about having a stroke or MI which should make falling asleep impossible. But that may be ok because another study reported that sleeping 9 or more hours increases stroke risk compared to just being in bed (sleeping or not) for 6-7 hours. Maybe they should try reading each other's studies.

There was an article from Australia that I liked, entitled, "Statins may not confer memory cognition decline in older patients." The patients were 70-90 years old and were followed for 6 years. Patient who had ever taken a statin and those who never took a statin had the same decline in memory function. First, who finds this reassuring? Second, they had 40% of the population who never took a statin. Word must travel slowly in Australia. The lesson from this study should have been, start using statins more often. Maybe they just forgot.

Finally, there was the article I would subtitle, "Did you really need to do this study?" "Research Indicates Deportation Worries Tied To Elevated Risk For High Blood Pressure Among Mexican-Born Women In California." A study of 572 women suggests fear of deportation doubles the risk of high blood pressure in Mexican-born women in farmworker families who live in California's Salinas Valley. Among the 408 women without high blood pressure at the outset, those with moderate or high levels of worry were twice as likely as others to be diagnosed with high blood pressure. I would be more interested in learning how the 28% of the women in the study who only had a low level of worry managed that. I bet they also didn't have insomnia. These are the people we should be studying.
